TOWNSHIP CLEAN-UP WEEK

April 18 thru 22



The big dumpsters will be at township hall for residents to dispose of household items, appliances, steel and metal. We will pay for Freon removal from appliances. Employees will be on hand from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. Monday thru Thursday and on Friday from 7 a.m. to 11 a.m. to assist as you unload your vehicle. **DO NOT BRING** tires, brush, oil, paint, batteries, boats, vehicles or propane tanks. Scrapping for metal is **PROHIBITED** and will be enforced by the Danbury Police. Clean-up weeks will also be held July 18 thru 22 and October 17 thru 21.



IMPORTANT DATES TO REMEMBER

APRIL 1

Brush drop-off opens at 310 Bridge Road behind the dog park for residents to drop branches and limbs during daylight hours. Contractors are NOT permitted to use this service. NO stumps or grass clippings.

APRIL 1

Cemetery clean-up begins. Please remove anything you wish to save prior to this date.

APRIL and MAY

Leaf drop-off for residents at the brush site. Bring loose leaves or use biodegradable bags.

Also on all Mondays from 8 a.m. to 9 a.m. beginning April 25 **EXCEPT** not on July 18, October 17 or any legal holidays. We can also load your vehicle by appointment.
