CLEAN-UP WEEKS HAVE RETURNED!

Our first clean-up of the year is April 22 through 26. The big dumpsters will be at township hall for residential disposal of household items, appliances, steel and metal. We pay for appliance Freon removal.

PLEASE REVIEW THE RULES BELOW

HOURS: 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. Monday through Thursday and on Friday from 7 a.m. to 11 a.m. Dumpsters and the unloading area will be CLOSED and monitored by the Danbury Police during all other hours.

UNLOADING: Employees will assist with loads up to 80 pounds. You are expected to help unload your vehicle if you are physically capable.

DO NOT BRING: Tires, brush, oil, paint, batteries, boats, vehicles, propane tanks or loose building materials (specifically shingles, drywall or insulation). All loose materials of any kind must be boxed or bagged.

METAL SCRAPPING: is prohibited and enforced by the Danbury Police.

NO COMMERCIAL LOADS: This service is only for residents.

MAINTENANCE STAFF HAS THE RIGHT TO REFUSE ANY LOAD.

Next clean-up weeks: July 15 through 19 and October 21 through 25.

➡ Our dog park on SR 269 (Bridge Road) is open daily from dawn till dusk. Expect muddy conditions until the park dries out in mid-summer. Park rules are found on the township website under Departments/Service & Maintenance/Parks & Historical Sites.



➡ A yellow Labrador Retriever is being trained as our newest K-9 Officer. Patrolman Brian Sloan will be our K-9 Handler. Look for these two to be on the road at the end of March.

APRIL 1 BRUSH DROP-OFF OPENS at 310 Bridge Rd. behind the dog park. Residents may drop off limbs and branches during daylight hours. No stumps or grass clippings. CONTRACTORS ARE NOT PERMITTED.

APRIL 1 CEMETERY CLEAN-UP BEGINS

Remove what you wish to save prior to this date.

APRIL AND MAY LEAF DROP-OFF for residents at the brush site. Bring loose leaves or biodegradable bags.

FREE MULCH...BEGINNING APRIL 1

Help yourself to mulch at the brush drop-off site during daylight hours. We can load your vehicle for you, while supplies last, from 8 a.m. to 9 a.m. on Mondays (**EXCEPT** not on April 22, July 15, October 21 or any legal holidays) and from 8 a.m. to noon on Saturdays: April 6 and 20 and May 4 and 18. We also load vehicles by appointment.

Monthly township meetings are held the 2nd & 4th Wednesdays at 6:30 p.m. in the lower meeting room of Danbury Township Hall at 5972 Port Clinton Eastern Rd. Come join us!

Township Hall is an **EMERGENCY SHELTER** during severe weather. The police will open the hall within a few minutes of sirens being activated. Sirens are tested at noon on the 1st Friday of each month.

Campers and motor homes **CANNOT** be inhabited on private property or used as “overflow” for guests. It is a violation of Zoning and Board of Health regulations.

Their use is only permitted in campgrounds.
