State of Ohio Orders and Restrictions

- With concerns over COVID-19 and with large populations sheltered at home, the Ohio Committee for Severe Weather Awareness is cancelling the Statewide Tornado Drill which was part of Spring Severe Weather Awareness Week.
- Mass gathers over 50 people are banned in the State of Ohio.
- Additional facilities required to close include
 - Fitness centers
 - Bowling alleys
 - Indoor water parks
 - Indoor trampoline parks
 - Movie theatres
 - Recreation Centers
 - The Primary Election in the State of Ohio has been postponed until June 2, 2020

- No testing unless present illness, have traveled, been exposed.
- No drive-thru's for testing has been planned.

Ottawa County EMA

County EOC Objectives:

- Coordinate the Ottawa County's response to limit spread of COVID-19 and maintain medical care.
- Provide information to the public, stakeholders and media on COVID-19 and actions the public can take to keep themselves safe.
- Determine how county agencies will continue delivery of essential services to Ottawa County residents while following COVID-19 public health guidelines.
- We have been reviewing plans, supply chains and our supplies.
- PPE is in short supply worldwide and we are doing what we can to try to acquire resources, but we need the support of the community.
- We have been in communication with all the county EMAs in our area to ensure we can back each other as needed. We had a call yesterday with our North Central Sector EMA directors to touch base. Our communication with the Ottawa County Health Department continues, as well as with numerous other agencies both governmental, non-profit and the private sector. EMA staff will be assuming various roles to stream line the rapid influx of demands placed on the EMA. These roles will be flexible to accommodate the increase in meetings, conference calls and providing information to the public.
- It is the goal of the EMA to provide the most up-to-date information, how it may impact Ottawa County residents, communities, businesses and visitors. We will be providing a situation report based on information received in to our EOC. Our goal is to not only improve communication to our county, but to encourage communication from communities to our office.

Actions Taken to Date

Magruder Hospital

- Call center is up and running. Daily from 8:00 a.m. – 5:00 p.m. Staffed by two RNs and then will transfer to the ER after hours. 419-301-4304
- A Respiratory Urgent Care Center will be set up in Suite 300. Tests will be sent out through their commercial lab department.
- Screening of all visitors. Patients are allowed one visitor per day.
- Statistics:
 - 10 suspected
 - 1 test pending
 - 0 confirmed cases
 - 5 employees in self-quarantine
- Anticipate need for additional PPE.

Fire/EMS

- PPE will become a concern.

Long Term Care

- They continue to monitor residents on a daily basis.
- Large group activities have been suspended. Lunch is being served in smaller groups.
- They continue to educate staff and screen them daily upon arrival.
- Ohio Department of Health has changed their ruling for Hospice patients and they are allowed visitors. There are currently 8 patients in hospice care.
- They have a new, 17 bed rehab unit waiting for approval to be used.

Job and Family Services

- Flexing work schedules with employees.
- Unemployment program is being used with a few initial problems.

Service Organizations

- Office is closed to clients.
- Salvation Army has financial assistance available for rent, utilities, etc.
- Wednesday thru Saturday from 4:00 p.m. – 6:00 p.m. meals are available for pick up at the side door of the Sutton Center through the Bistro.
- Senior Resources is unable to take new food clients. Meals for them will be available from the Bistro.

Schools

- Limited staff in buildings. Board of Education offices are open.
- Service coordination of meals has been difficult.

Mental Health

- Bayshore and Firelands is open for business. If preferred clients can select to call-in versus face-to-face.

Village of Oak Harbor

- Seniors are welcome to sign-up for a daily welfare check phone call.
- During this pandemic crisis, water will not be shut off. Residents would need to call the Water Department if they receive a shut-off notice. Randy Genzman will check with other villages.

City of Port Clinton

- During this pandemic crisis, water will not be shut off. Residents would need to call the Water Department if they receive a shut-off notice.

Senior Centers

- The Senior Centers in Ottawa County due to the Coronavirus pandemic in an effort to protect our senior population. The centers will be closed effective March 16 through April 3, 2020 and will be reevaluated at that time. The senior centers will offer Grab and Go meals during normal meal time specific to each center.

Municipal Court

- Modification of Court Procedures
- Please be advised, effective immediately, The Ottawa County Municipal Court will be allowing filings, pleadings, and motions to be filed by e-mail. An e-mail document will be accepted as an original and the signature accepted as an original consistent with Civil Rule S (E). No additional paperwork need be filed. You must provide all case information, including the case number, on the filing.

- Pre-Trials and other selected hearings will be conducted by phone until further notice. The Prosecutor's Office and/or the Court will initiate the calls.
- Essential bearings will continue to be heard in the courtroom for as long as the Courthouse remains open.
- Cases that will require a continuance will be reset on a case-by-case basis.

Resource Needs

- Shortage of PPE will become a problem.
- Ohio EMA has asked about Call Centers. Lucas County Health Department has been overwhelmed with calls from beyond their district. Nancy suggested contacting Ohio Department of Health, 833-427-5634

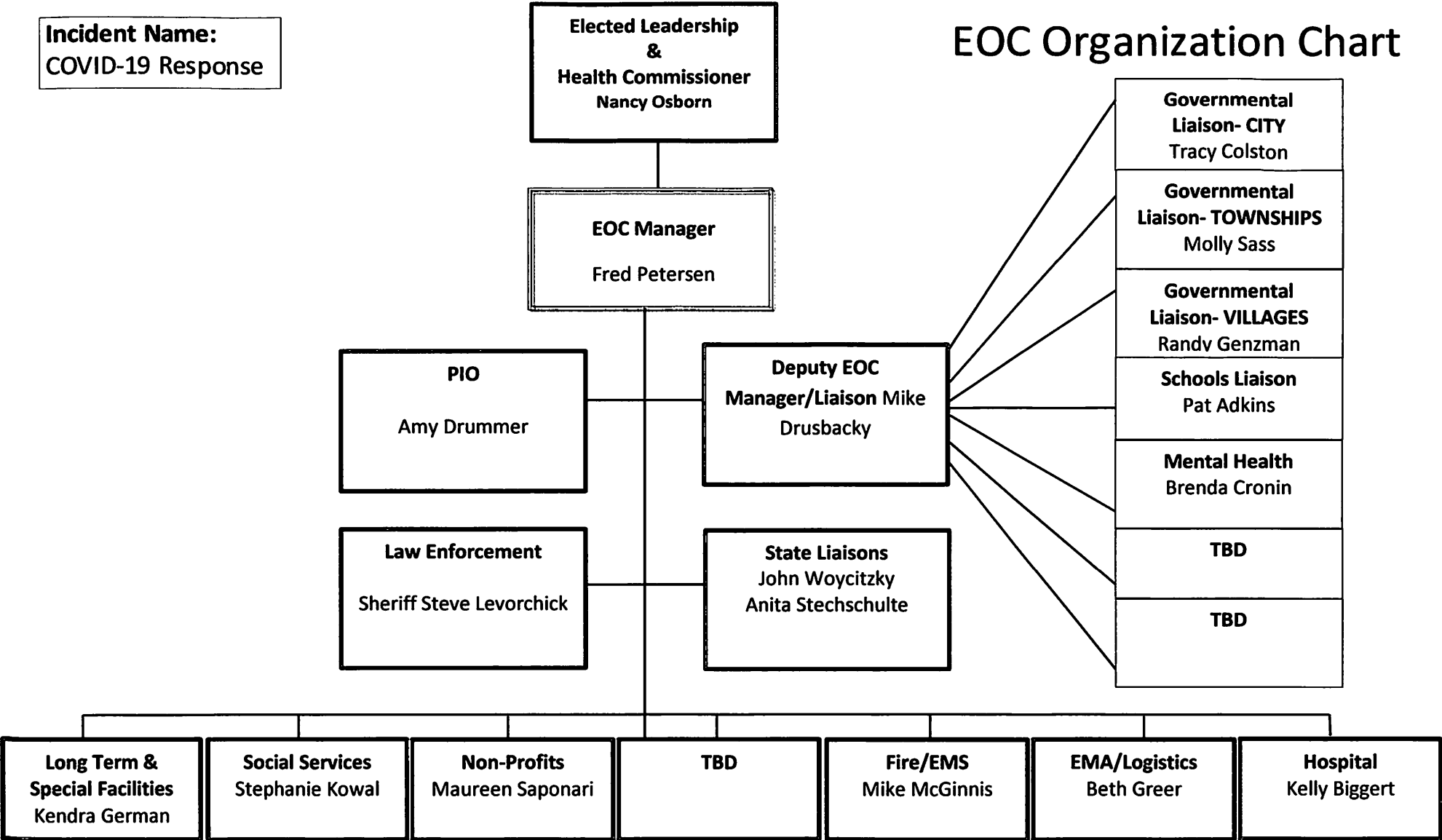
